Prelude Enrollment FAQs

I have children who are not preschool age. Can I sign them up?

Our program's curriculum is geared towards children between the ages of 2.9 months and 5 years old, as these are the ages for traditional preschool. However, we will accept children between the ages of 2 and 6 for our remote program!

I have multiple children at home. Do I have to pay more than once?

All students participating in Prelude Preschool's remote programming need to be formally enrolled in our programs. If you're enrolling more than 1 student in our Bravissimo! program, tuition will be due for each child. If you're enrolling more than 1 child in our Bravo! and Encore! programs, you will NOT owe additional tuition.

Is there unlimited enrollment space?

Bravissimo! is only available to the first 25 children who are enrolled. Bravo! and Encore! programs have unlimited enrollment capacity.

Can I switch to a different program during the year?

If you would like to shift to a different program during the year, you will be given access to the new program's content at the beginning of the following week. Your invoice will be updated to reflect your new balance. Any over-payment will be credited to you for future lessons and classes. No refunds will be issued for remote Prelude programming.

Can I un-enroll during the year?

You may un-enroll if you do not plan to use the programming anymore. All withdrawal requests must be submitted in writing to the Prelude Director. No refunds will be issued for remote Prelude programming.

What is your refund policy?

No refunds will be issued for remote Prelude programming.

Do you offer scholarships?

We are committed to providing scholarships to families in need at each tier of programming. What is your policy about media consent?

All enrolled students will need to accept a media consent waiver at online checkout. Any media we collect during our programming will be sent to parents for approval prior to public usage. We may ask families to take photos and videos of children learning at home, which will only be used publicly with parent consent.
